Yes, God spoke through the Panama Mission Team this week in Lidice. What a fulfilling experience we had on our mission trip. We worshipped and played together with our family at the Shahah Church where Pastor Moises and many wonderful, spirit filled Panamanians meet each week and many every day to praise our Holiest of Holy Father. This mission was youth oriented and we met and worked with many young people in this growing church. It was uplifting to see the teenagers willing to go out into their community to witness to both young and old alike. Members of the team went with them to homes, schools---yes, the schools allow Christ within their doors!—parks, improvised soccer fields, grocery stores, and other places in the area. We gave out tracks entitled Vida Eterna (Eternal Life) to those willing to hear about Christ and the salvation only He offers. The picture here is one of many success stories. It is of a 90-year old gentleman we met in the park as we cleaned it up for our outdoor concert. He had never heard the good news of Christ and was led through the team, led by Jim and our fantastic interpreter Julio, to salvation in the Lord.

While this short article does not do justice to the many activities and outcomes of our trip, I want to share the comments of our team which included children, youth and adults. It is hoped you will see the meaningful and life changing experiences of this mission through these comments. The question posed was “What did you do, love or learn while on our Panama mission?” **Jack Nerney:** I really enjoyed meeting the people and embracing the culture. It was really special that I was given the opportunity to speak about Christ at a school we visited. Most importantly, I was able to witness two men accepting Christ. **Cole Nerney:** I really loved this trip mostly because I saw God working. A 90-year man came to Christ which was amazing. This trip has also made me much braver. I feel much better about prayer and spreading the word. **Mike Wolfe:** I loved being on this trip. What was really great was how many friends I made at Shahah even though we speak another language. As soon as I got here I felt like I gained another family. **Will Nerney** (9 yrs old): I liked playing soccer, learning all the songs and being friends with the Panama kids. **Zack Dean:** The one thing that struck me most about Panama was not the oppressive heat and humidity; rather, the people were so willing to accept us regardless of cultural differences and a strong language barrier. Never before have I felt such a sense of unity and I’m glad to call the people of Shahah church my brothers and sisters in Christ. **Kya Reger:** I enjoyed the food, the fellowship, with my friends and enjoyed the new music I learned each day! I wish I lived there. **Sammy Hastings:** I loved this mission trip because it still felt like home when we arrived. **Felicity Reger:** I really, really loved this trip because I liked the songs they taught us. And the love that was spread! **Gretchen Reger:** I really enjoyed this trip because I made new friends and played soccer. The best part was when I heard that someone had accepted Christ! I saw God working in so many ways as we planted seeds! **Kalea Reger** (4 yrs old): Thanks to my big brothers and sisters of Shiloh and Panama. I had a great time. **Gunner Reger** (6 yrs old): Soccer! **Joe Busic:** Panama was an amazing experience. I will never forget the smiles on all of our faces. I feel truly blessed to have been on this trip and will never forget it. **Chris Nerney:** I loved the passion for Christ that the members of Shahah showed and I loved hearing Pastor Moises pray in Spanish. **Christine Nerney:** In Panama I felt the Holy Spirit in a bigger and more powerful way. However, I was reminded during devotions that the Holy Spirit was with me before I came here and will be with me when I get home and therefore I am always equipped to be a witness for Jesus. **Jim Reger** (our fantastic, spirit-filled leader): Panama is a beautiful country with beautiful people. I love serving with our brothers and sisters from Shahah. I am also impressed with our group’s flexibility and the love they show. God was glorified and we all were very satisfied. **Christian Reger:** God is always in control, always reminding us to keep focused and He will do anything to make sure that all the attention stays on Him, and that He is Glorified and seen thru everything. **Brenda Hastings:** What a joy to serve our Lord with believers across the seas! His love abounds and He is always in control! May His name be glorified forever! **Bryce Ferguson (CBBC Youth Ldr):** God has taught me so much about His grace this week. He truly is an awesome God. **Phil Lehman:** The tourist guide I was given in Customs when we arrived was titled “Panama Welcome”. THIS really summarized the trip for me. We were WELCOMED (yes all caps) in the church, in the houses, in the schools and in the community park, to sing, perform skits, play soccer, pray, and the talk about Jesus. We were with Lidice people from 8 am to 10 or 11 pm each day. It is impossible to imagine that kind of “Welcome” (particularly to Christ’s message) in the U.S. **Gail Davis:** JOY! Sheer joy! The faces and voices of our friends and their families at Shahah seemed to always speak of joy and peace. Their spirited songs and games, discussions, prayers, all reflected joy of heart and soul. They do not have a beautiful church, they do not have beautiful homes, they are not endowed with lots of money, but they do have beautiful spirit and joy. This joy is contagious and it is my prayer that you all will be filled with the joy of these God-loving, spirit-filled people. And that this joy will be what others in King George see at and in Shiloh Baptist Church.
